2009/2010 was an exciting and successful year filled with many challenges. The implementation of full day learning for 4 and 5 year olds moved forward with The Ministry of Education amending the Education Act and passing Bill 242. Schools were selected and school boards were provided guidelines as to the development of the new program.

Due to our strong partnerships with both the Peel District School Board and Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board, PLASP was selected to operate programs in 26 of the 36 schools with Full Day Learning. PLASP worked with the school boards to ensure the Before and After School component followed the Ministry guidelines. As Full Day Learning moves forward, we are committed to continuing to work with school boards to provide the best service possible to families of pre-school, kindergarten and school age children.

PLASP's reputation for quality programs continues to be reinforced in the community, year over year. PLASP has won the Readers' Choice Awards from the Mississauga News Newspaper for Best Child Care Provider and City Parent Magazine for Best Before and After School Program, for 13 years in a row! Parent level of satisfaction with service for the year was an outstanding 99.6%!

PLASP's success comes from strong partnerships, collaborative approaches with community agencies, sound financial management and the effective use of technology. Board governance remains a priority with PLASP's Board of Directors and together, with senior staff, the focus is on providing the best service possible to families, services that are affordable, accessible, high quality and well-managed.

Serving our Community

PLASP provided high quality early learning, care and enrichment, to 8,525 children from 6,947 families in 2009/2010. School Age programs included Before School, After School, Lunch, P.A. Days and Summer, Winter Holiday and March Break Camps. Early Learning and Child Care Centres offered Infant, Toddler, Preschool, Kindergarten and Nursery School programs.

Award Winning Service

For 13 years in a row, PLASP has been recognized by the readers of the Mississauga News Newspaper as Best provider of Child Care and by the readers of City Parent Magazine as Best Before and After School Program Provider.



A new school age program opened in Toronto at Nativity of our Lord Catholic School, bringing the number of Before and After School locations to 187.

Parent Survey Results

PLASP survey results remained at an outstanding **99.6% overall parent level of satisfaction for 2009/2010**. Our annual parent survey continues to show that we are meeting the needs of our families. **84% of families completed a survey**. A breakdown of the results for each location was given to staff to help with goal setting and improvements for programs.

Highlights in Review

2009 Annual Parent and Community Meeting

During the Community Reception, special presentations were made to Jim Grieve, retiring Director of Education, Peel District School Board, and Ron Lenyk, former Publisher of the Mississauga News Newspaper.



Volunteers and Students-on-Placement ...

The **28th Annual Volunteer and Student-on-Placement Recognition Event**, was held on May 6, 2010. PLASP recognized the contributions of more than 790 volunteers and 190 students-on-placement along with the PLASP Board of Directors and Committee Members, who together contributed more than 54,230 hours this year.



The theme for the event was “Plan to be Excellent - A Night of Stars”. The sights and sounds of the tropical rainforest set the stage for the guest speaker, **Yvonne Camus**, a member of the Canadian rookie team, who completed the 2000 Eco-Challenge race in the rainforests of Borneo. Yvonne shared the importance and need for hard work, persistence and teamwork; explaining that success comes to those who are willing to work hard for it, not those who leave it to chance.



Full Day Learning for 4 and 5 Year Olds

Throughout the 2009/2010 year PLASP worked with the school boards, as the Ministry of Education moved forward with the implementation of full day learning for 4 and 5 year olds. Amendments were made to the Education Act and Bill 242 was passed. Schools were selected by school boards and approved by the Ministry of Education to operate full day kindergarten in September 2010.

In Peel, the school boards chose to use current child care providers to operate the before and after school programs for 4 and 5 year olds. PLASP was selected to operate programs in 20 Peel District

School Board schools and in 6 Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board schools. Working in the school boards, PLASP ensured the development of high quality, early learning programs before and after school for 4 and 5 year olds.

To secure enrolment in these programs for September 2010, PLASP launched an extensive promotional campaign with advertisement, flyers and mailings, as well as attendance at kindergarten registration and “Welcome to Kindergarten” events. PLASP staff and families were continually informed about the implementation of this program.

Community Involvement

PLASP joined the Quality Early Learning Network (QELN), a group of not-for-profit, multi-site operators in the City of Toronto, Durham, York, Peel, Halton, Hamilton/Wentworth and Middlesex Regions, collectively provide services to 35,100 children and employ 3,150 early childhood educators. This group is deeply committed to the provision of high quality early childhood experiences for children ranging from infancy through to age twelve. Members attended legislative hearings on Bill 242 and met with M.P.P.'s to discuss the implementation of Full Day Kindergarten programs.

PLASP continued with the Raising the Bar initiative, led by the Region of Peel, whose goal is to raise the quality of all

licensed early learning and child care programs in Peel. By June 2010, all 20 of PLASP's Early Learning and Child Care Centres achieved their Silver Certification.

PLASP continued its involvement with community organizations that support children. Representatives from PLASP were present on the Success by 6 Council of Champions and Executive Team, Child Development Resource Connection Peel committees, the Multi-Site Operators Group within the Region of Peel as well as the Sheridan College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning Program Advisory Committee, Fair Share Task Force and the Best Start initiative.



Board Governance

The Board of Directors continued moving forward on training and development programs for board governance. The Board's focus for 2009/2010 was the future direction of PLASP and the impact of full day learning. New policies established, included Violence in the Workplace and Harassment.

Our Future

PLASP is committed to providing families with high quality early learning and child care programs for children up to 12 years of age. With the implementation of full day learning for 4 and 5 year olds in kindergarten, PLASP will continue to work with school boards to provide the best programs possible that meet Ministry standards and surpass expectations. As we enter our 35th year of operation, we will be celebrating PLASP's success, as an industry leader.

Strategic Direction

Balance Scorecard and Strategy Map measures were reviewed and reported on throughout the year. PLASP Balanced Scorecard measures focus on four areas of the organization, Families and Partners, Learning and Growth, Internal Processes and Financial Resources.

Information technology moved forward with Balanced Scorecard initiatives and began development of a **web portal for PLASP**.

Financial Overview

PLASP continues to focus on ensuring that a high quality, accessible service is provided to families and that fees are reasonable and competitive. Maintaining a balanced budget, while ensuring the effective operation of programs, is a priority. PLASP will move forward in a strong financial position next year, focusing on strengthening the services provided and their reputation in the marketplace.

In the past year 1,342 children were provided with fee assistance from either the Region of Peel, Children's Services or PLASP. PLASP ended the year with a net loss of \$ 174,093. This loss was budgeted in the fiscal year and was funded from reserves accumulated from previous years.
