The Board of Directors is committed to ensuring PLASP programs remain strong. Working together with staff, we will ensure PLASP programs grow and thrive. Through the second half of the year, PLASP's highly trained competent staff, continued to provide children and families with excellent, high quality services. As we move forward, we are committed to hiring a new Chief Executive Officer who shares the values and vision of the organization, ensuring Sylvia's legacy lives on.

PLASP's reputation for quality programs continued to be reinforced by the community in 2010 – 2011. PLASP won the Readers' Choice Awards from the Mississauga News Newspaper for Best Child Care Provider, and City Parent

Magazine for Best Before and After School Programs, for the 14th year! The parent level of satisfaction for the year was an outstanding 99.6%! Thank you to all the staff for your dedication and commitment to PLASP.

September 2010 saw 4 and 5 year olds go to school for full day Kindergarten, and PLASP was there for them before and after school. Throughout the year, PLASP worked with the schools to ensure these children were provided with excellent before and after school programs. In May, provincial legislation came into force that allowed third party providers to continue to operate before and after school programs for full day kindergarten children, beyond the first year.

PLASP's collaboration with many community agencies continues to ensure that cost effective, high quality, accessible programs and services are available for children and families. We would like to recognize and thank the many community partners who offered their support during this difficult time.

As a parent, knowing that your children are in exceptional programs, where they are valued, cared for, and understood, in a safe environment, provides you with peace of mind. Thank you to our families, for entrusting your children into our care each day.

We look forward to providing many years of service to families in Peel and Toronto. PLASP is recognized as a leader in the field of child care programs and we will continue to ensure all children, and families, are provided with high quality early learning and child care programs.

Serving our Community

During PLASP's 35th year, high quality early learning, care and recreation, was provided to 8,742 children from 7,062 families. School Age Programs included Before School, After School, Lunch and P.A. Day trips. Early Learning and Child Care Centres offered Infant, Toddler, Preschool, Kindergarten and Nursery School programs.

Full Day Learning for 4 and 5 Year Olds

In September 2010, PLASP expanded its services in 10 schools to include Before and After School Programs for 4 and 5 year olds in full day kindergarten. Working collaboratively with principals, teachers and school board staff throughout the year, these programs had an excellent beginning.

In May 2011, amendments to the Education Act, Bill 173, were passed, allowing third party operators to provide Before and After School Programs to children in full day kindergarten beyond the first year. As full day kindergarten is implemented over the next 4 years, PLASP will continue to work with school boards to ensure families are provided with high quality Before and After School Programs for 4 and 5 year olds.



Award Winning Service

For 14 years in a row, PLASP has been recognized by the readers of the Mississauga News Newspaper as Best provider of Child Care, and by the readers of City Parent Magazine as Best Before and After School Program Provider.

Parent Survey Results - 99.6%

PLASP survey results remained at an outstanding **99.6% overall parent level of satisfaction for 2010/2011**. Our annual parent survey continues to show that we are meeting the needs of our families. **84%** of families completed a survey.

▼ Staff Reorganization and Recognition Day 2010

The Staff Reorganization and Recognition Day was held on August 30, 2010. One hundred and fifty four (154) staff were recognized for length of service awards. These included staff who had been with PLASP for 25, 20, 15, 10, 5 and 3 years. Guest speaker for the event was Wayne Hulley who spoke on "Up, Up and Away, Making the Most of Every Day".



Gail McAllister, Relief/Resource Program Director who has been with PLASP for 29 years, was awarded the Kay Stroud Award. This award recognizes a PLASP employee for their outstanding achievement in the development of early learning and school age child care.



► Volunteers and Students on Placement

The 29th Annual Volunteer and Student on Placement Recognition Event, was held on April 4, 2011. PLASP recognized 19 Board and Committee Members, more than 800 volunteers and 155 students on placement, who contributed a total of more than 50,000 hours of service.

The theme for the event was "One Person Can Make a World of Difference - A Night of Stars". The guest speaker was Craig Kielburger, co-founder of Free the Children and Me to We. Craig provided a passionate and empowering presentation on how "One Person Can Make a World of Difference."



► 2010 Annual Parent and Community Meeting

The PLASP Annual Parent and Community Meeting was held on October 18, 2010, at the Living Arts Centre in Mississauga, with

approximately 1,300 guests in attendance. Guest speaker for the event was **Dr. Stuart Shanker**, distinguished research professor of Philosophy and Psychology at York University. Dr. Shanker provided guests with information about raising self-regulating children. His presentation focused on how a child's brain develops, and what parents could do to support their healthy growth and development.

At the Community Reception, prior to the Parent Meeting, special presentations were made to **John Huether**, retiring Chair, Fair Share Task Force and Chair, Success by 6 Peel; **Lorna Reid**, retired Director of Children's Services, Region of Peel; and **Judith Nyman**, retired Interim Director of Education, Peel District School Board.



Community Involvement

In November, PLASP staff and children participated in the Brampton Santa Claus Parade and the Mississauga Santa Claus Parade. The theme for PLASP was based on the Nutcracker Suite with mice, drummers, soldiers, the Rat King, the Sugar Plum Fairy and the Nutcracker Prince all participating.

PLASP continued its involvement with community organizations that support children. Representatives from PLASP participated on the Success by 6 Council of Champions and Executive Team, Child Development Resource Connection Peel committees, the Peel Multi-Site Operators Group, QELN (Quality Early Learning Network), as well as the Sheridan College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning Program Advisory Committee, Fair Share Task Force and the Best Start Initiative.

PLASP moved forward with the Raising the Bar initiative, led by the Region of Peel, whose goal is to raise the quality of all licensed early learning and child care programs in Peel. By March 2011, all 20 of PLASP's Early Learning and Child Care Centres achieved their Gold Certification.



Strategic Directions

The Strategy Map and Balanced Scorecard Measures were reviewed and reported on throughout the year. Balanced Scorecard Measures focus on four areas of the organization, Families and Partners, Learning and Growth, Internal Processes and Financial Resources. PLASP Board members moved forward with Strategic Planning, reviewing PLASP's vision, mission and values, as well as the key issues and desired future for the organization.

PLASP continued to move forward with advancements in the use of mobile technology and on the development of a web portal. PLASP began work with Conversion Marketing, a brand publishing company, to enhance the promotion of PLASP services online, and develop brand standards for the organization.

Our Future

For 35 years, PLASP has been providing families with high quality early learning and child care programs. PLASP is a strong and financially stable organization that continues to grow and thrive. Sylvia Leal will be greatly missed in the years to come, but her legacy remains. With the Education Act amended allowing third party operators to provide before and after school programs for children in full day kindergarten, PLASP services will continue to expand. Our collaborative partnerships with the school boards continue to ensure children are provided with high quality programs, right in their schools.

The Board of Directors and staff at PLASP are committed to ensuring PLASP's vision and mission continues. Families will receive the same high quality programs they have come to expect, for years to come.

The Loss of a Child Care Champion

Sylvia Leal – PLASP CEO – 1978 – 2011



Sylvia Leal, leader of PLASP Child Care Services for 33 years, passed away suddenly on January 13, 2011. Sylvia will be remembered as a visionary and champion for children. Sylvia believed that each child should be respected, valued, and understood, and it was this belief that was the basis for her vision for PLASP, and her impact on child care in the community.



Highlights of Sylvia's Success...

- In January **1978**, accepted position as Program Coordinator at PLASP, overseeing 10 staff, with 6 school age programs, in 5 schools, providing services to 200 children.
- In **1980**, PLASP was incorporated as a not-for-profit, charitable organization and Sylvia was appointed to the position of Executive Director.
- **1982** PLASP grew to 74 staff, with programs offered in 31 different schools, providing services to more than 1,500 children.
- **1987** Sylvia was recognized with Credit Valley Hospital's Dr. Robert Bates Award for her outstanding contribution to the physical, emotional, and social well-being of children.
- **1988** PLASP opened the first 2 early learning and child care centres and over the next five years, opened 15 more.
- **1990** PLASP worked with the Ministry of Community and Social Services to develop a set of protocols to license school age programs.
- **1999**, Sylvia was recognized by the Association of Early Childhood Educators' Ontario (AECEO), Peel Branch, as the Week of the Child Award Recipient.
- Throughout the years, Sylvia built strong community relationships with Trustees, Councillors, M.P.P's, M.P's and the Mayors of Caledon and Mississauga, as well as with staff at the school boards, Ministry of Children and Youth Services, Ministry of Education, the Region of Peel, and many community groups

including Child Development Resource Connection Peel, Success by 6 Peel and Fair Share Task Force.

- Under Sylvia's leadership, PLASP has been recognized by the readers of City Parent Magazine and the Mississauga News Newspaper as the provider of choice for Child Care and Before and After School Programs for 14 years in a row.
- Parent survey results show a level of satisfaction of over 99% for more than ten years.
- Sylvia's astute business management grew PLASP from a grass roots organization to a strong business with a \$28 million budget.

PLASP has grown into a successful organization providing care to more than 8,700 children from 7,000 families annually. With 700 highly trained staff delivering the PLASP mission every day, Sylvia's vision to foster each child's and staff's self-esteem, feeling of self-worth and value, lives on. Parents, children, staff and community partners have all benefitted greatly from Sylvia's commitment to excellence, ensuring the best programs and services are available for children and families in Peel and beyond.

Tributes to Sylvia

Many individuals and organizations paid tribute to Sylvia throughout the year. Donations were generously made in her memory, to the PLASP subsidy fund, by many friends and staff members of PLASP.

On **May 18, 2011**, a **Tribute to Sylvia - Community Event** was held at the Mississauga Convention Centre. Guest speakers included Shelley White, CEO, United Way of Peel; Beryl Ford, Trustee for Brampton Wards 7/8, Peel District School Board; Anna Abbruscato, Chair & Trustee Mississauga Ward 4, Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board; Vince Tedesco, Regional Director, Ministry of Children and Youth Services; Andre Mak, President, Makvision; John Huether, former Chair, Fair Share Task Force and Chair, Success by 6 Peel; Ron Lenyk, Director, Zenko Communications and Event Management; Jane van Berkel, Executive Director, Child Development Resource Connection Peel, and Humphrey Mitchell, Executive Director, Peel Children's Centre.

During the evening, Sylvia was posthumously awarded the **Mary Neville Award**, by Humphrey Mitchell, Executive Director, Peel Children's Centre, honouring her outstanding contribution in the areas of prevention and early intervention in children's mental health.

On **June 2, 2011**, a **Tribute to Sylvia – Staff Event** was held at the Mississauga Convention Centre. Several staff, Glen Shipp, President of PLASP Board and Fern Gue, Trainer and long time friend, spoke about Sylvia. A special presentation of a bronze sculpture entitled "Jack and Jill" was unveiled to staff, which is on display in the reception area of the PLASP Head Office.

Also in June, Parent council and school staff at Pauline Vanier Catholic School, paid tribute to Sylvia, by presenting plaques to our centre and school age program staff.

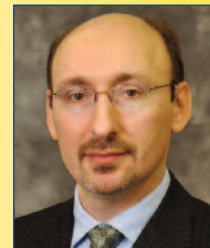

Financial Overview

PLASP continues to provide high quality, accessible services to families at reasonable and competitive rates. Throughout the year, improvements focused on strengthening PLASP's brand, and efficiencies in the administration of services.

In the 2010/2011 year, 1,504 children from 1,132 families were provided with fee assistance from the Region of Peel, Children's Services or PLASP's Subsidy Fund. PLASP ended the year with a surplus of \$ 679,717. These funds will be allocated to reserves to support the organization in the years to come.

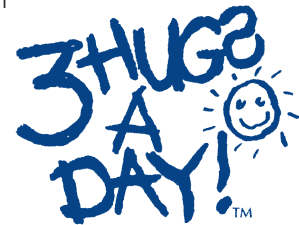
