50 Years of PLASP

There is much to celebrate this year - our 50th Anniversary. While much has changed over the decades, what's important about PLASP remains the same.

Families have always relied on us for high-quality child care programs. We certainly provide places where children want to be! The photos from the past 50 years tell the story of happy children and families with peace of mind knowing their child is in a safe, caring environment.

Our motto - *3 Hugs a Day* - has been with us for 40 years and today we continue to share this message.

It's certainly evident that our name and reputation have created a lasting legacy in the communities we serve. We continue to see growth in early learning and child care across the country and at PLASP.

Growth in child care

In 2024-25, we opened five new Early Learning and Child Care Centres, along with school age locations - and we have plans to open four more locations in the coming year. The demand for child care remains high and we continue to expand to meet this need.

As we expand into new locations, we know we need the skilled workforce to operate these programs. We continue to focus on recruitment and retention of exceptional staff. We know we offer staff an exceptional workplace experience, including unparalleled opportunities for training and professional growth.

Working with our partners

PLASP continues to participate in the <u>Canada-Wide Early Learning</u> and <u>Child Care system</u>, which continues to reduce fees for parents with children under six years of age. The remaining fee reductions are to come by the end of 2026, providing families with child care for an average of \$10 per day.

PLASP actively provides feedback to the Ministry of Education and local government, sharing our perspectives and expertise about the direction of child care under this new system. As an active member of the Quality Early Learning Network (a non-profit, multi-site, multi-service, licensed child care operators network), we share a consolidated voice in spearheading changes. In addition, we work with school boards, local community agencies and families to impact and shape child care programs in our community.

Strategic directions

This past year we continued to make progress on our strategic priorities - People, Programs, Partnerships and Resources - with initiatives focused on training and retention, program enhancements and technology. In addition, we introduced an exciting new look for PLASP, which has been widely accepted.



As we continue to move forward with technological enhancements, PLASP will launch a new public facing website by the end of 2025. This new website has taken the feedback we have received from our stakeholders and will better service our clients with information on PLASP.

Our work means so much more when it is acknowledged by our families and peers. PLASP continues to receive the *Readers' Choice Awards* from the *Toronto Star, Mississauga News* and *Brampton Guardian*. Thank you for voting for us.

PLASP was chosen as Sheridan College's Work Integrated Learning (WIL) Employer of the Year for 2024. 
