This enthusiastic start to the year paved the way for us to provide programs to more than 17,000 children from 13,000 families. We opened three new Early Learning and Child Care Centres in Peel, now at 25 centres, and expanded school age programs in Toronto for a total of 226 schools with programs. PLASP programs are now found in schools in Scarborough, North York, Etobicoke, York and Toronto Centre. Our first Early Learning and Child Care Centre in Toronto will open in early 2019.

We believe in the importance of early learning

We believe that families deserve high quality programs for children. PLASP programs are guided by the Ontario Ministry of Education's pedagogy for the early years, "How Does Learning Happen?" Staff continue to learn and implement programming around the four foundations of learning – belonging, expression, engagement and well-being.

As the modernization of child care continues, the future shows growth in affordable and accessible programs for younger children, up to 4 years of age. PLASP continues to work with Children's Services and the school boards in Toronto and Peel to provide additional programs for children.

We believe in our communities connections

We were involved in more community events in the communities we serve. PLASP participated in three Santa Claus Parades located in Brampton, Etobicoke and Mississauga with a float that was recognized by the judges of the Brampton Parade as first runner up of the Chairman's Award. PLASP also participated in a selection of events in the spring including the Bread and Honey Festival in Mississauga and KiteFest in Brampton.

We believe that PLASP is a remarkable organization that has been providing high quality programs for families for 42 years. We hear from our families about how they love the programs and specifically our staff. Feedback from parents and staff throughout the year enables us to continuously improve programs.

During the 2017-18 school year, PLASP's inclusive environments provided care to 17,013 children from 13,134 families. Programs continued to expand with PLASP opening three new Early Learning and Child Care Centres in Peel at Red Willow Public School, St. Daniel Comboni Catholic School and Whaley's Corners Public School.

In addition to the three centres, PLASP opened ten locations with programs for school age and kindergarten children. The majority of these in Toronto where seven of the ten schools are located. Programs that PLASP provides include:

Back to School Area Meeting

On Monday, August 28 all staff were welcomed to another school year with Area Meetings taking place for staff at all locations throughout the day. Staff were welcomed by the PLASP mascots and head office staff, while enjoying a celebration breakfast or lunch with their colleagues. The meeting opened with a video showing head office and program staff along with children in programs holding chalkboards with "I Believe" and incorporated a message from Lynn Hiebert, PLASP CEO. Training during the meeting focused on PLASP policies and procedures needed to operate the high quality programs for children and families, before and after school and at our early learning and child care centres.



PLASP in the Community

PLASP was involved with many community events this year. The year started in the summer with the Erin Mills Fun Fair and the Newcomer Centre of Mississauga. PLASP participated in three Santa Claus Parades – Brampton, Etobicoke and Mississauga with a new float. The PLASP float garnered a lot of attention with PLASP winning first runner up of the Chairman's Award for best float in the Brampton Santa Parade. In the spring, PLASP participated in the Bread and Honey Festival in Streetsville and Brampton KiteFest.



Annual Parent and Community Meeting

On Monday, October 30, 2017, PLASP held the Annual Parent and Community Meeting at the International Centre. With almost 1,000 people in attendance, reports were given by Paul Street, President of the PLASP Board of Directors and Lynn Hiebert, CEO.

Greetings were brought by special guests Minister Indira Naidoo-Harris, Minister Responsible for Early Years and Child Care, from the Ontario Ministry of Education, Marianne Mazzorato, Director of Education, Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board, Peter Joshua, Director of Education, Peel District School Board, and Rory McGuckin, Director of Education, Toronto Catholic District School Board. In addition, Sharon Hobin, Vice-Chair, Trustee, Dufferin Peel Catholic District School Board and Barbara Poplawski, Trustee, Toronto Catholic District School Board also provided greetings on behalf of their school boards.



Neil Pasricha, New York Times bestselling author and award-winning blogger provided the keynote, speaking with parents about how they can create positive and productive environments at home for children by taking ownership of their own positive mindset. Pasricha's uplifting message left the audience with smiles on their faces.

Twenty-nine (29) donors sponsored the 2017 Parent and Community Meeting and were recognized and thanked for their financial assistance in making the event possible. Lead sponsors for the evening were Grocery Gateway by Longo's, Mississauga News, Brampton Guardian, and Etobicoke Guardian.



Volunteer Recognition Events

With more than 1,800 volunteers and students participating in PLASP programs and in the head office in the 2017-18 school year we wanted to ensure that all were recognized for their contributions. This year, each individual location, including the head office, held their own volunteer recognition event. A package of information was prepared for each location which included a banner, invites and party ideas for staff and children to do and celebrate. The volunteers each received a certificate and pin and presented with gifts from the children and staff in their programs.



Strategic Plan

Moving forward with PLASP's strategic goals as detailed in the Strategic Plan for 2016 – 2019, PLASP continued to make improvements in technology, implemented new tools for staff recruitment, retention and professional development and focused on program enhancements. Highlights included:

- 100% of PLASP Early Learning and Child Care Centres passed Raising the Bar certification.
- Provided new tablets for all programs including photo capability for documentation in programs and access to PLASP online systems
- Launched PLASP 2.0, a new mobile friendly website enabling parents/guardians to access all areas of the website using their mobile device.
- Working with an external company to develop a custom financial system enabling us to improve technology and support PLASP's future growth.
- Implemented a new Training Management System which allows staff to confirm training, send reminders and alerts and inform staff when courses have been rescheduled.
- Completed development of a business continuity plan that enables PLASP to continue to operate seamlessly with no business disruption.



Staff

With PLASP's continued growth in programs and services, staffing and professional development are key to our success. PLASP's 1,500 staff were provided continuous training at bi-monthly area meetings, regional meetings, administrative meetings and more. The focus throughout much of the year for program staff, was on "How Does Learning Happen?" Ontario's pedagogy for the early years, with an emphasis on the four foundations of learning, belonging, well-being, engagement and expression for all children. New this year, PLASP implemented a documentation strategy that had all program staff using their tablets to take photos of children in programs documenting their learning experiences for parents to see.



In November, PLASP introduced an Accommodation of Transgender Individuals Policy and brought in a speaker from The 519, Rogue Whitterick, who spoke on Gender Affirmation. This presentation, to all staff, spoke about accepting all individuals and provided descriptions as to how individuals identify themselves and how we should be recognizing them.

During the year the PLASP CEO held special small group sessions with all head office staff. These "Coffee Time" sessions comprised of small groups of four or five participants meeting directly with the CEO. In each session, the CEO engaged the staff in dialogue that encouraged open and candid feedback. Information was gathered with results presented to all staff involved.

Recommendations on improvements have been submitted by each department with implementation of these taking place throughout the next year.







Financial Overview

PLASP continues to provide licensed, high-quality, accessible programs to families at reasonable and competitive rates.

In 2017-2018, PLASP matched revenues and expenses plus invested for the future. Investing for the future included capital expenditures of \$576,344 funded primarily by reserves. PLASP continued to expand kindergarten and school age programs.

Also in 2017-2018, PLASP opened three new Early Learning Child Care Centres. Throughout the most recent fiscal year, PLASP continued to maintain a strong financial position.






